

Hello everyone!!

"Ask the Pro" is back!! This article is designed to bring informative and helpful tips to you about small engines and their care, repair, and maintenance. I have spent 34 years (20 of it professionally) turning a wrench as a small engine mechanic. I will share some of that knowledge with you here!

Oil changes on your lawn or garden tractor - is it really that important? The answer is YES it is!! Your lawn or garden tractor operates in some really nasty conditions. Most notably-dusty conditions while mowing and tilling the garden. This dust plugs up your air filter pretty quickly, which makes it imperative that you check and clean the filter regularly. These conditions also contaminate the oil, which is why it turns a jet black color over time.

Good rule of thumb is to change your engine oil once a year. If the conditions are severe and/or you mow commercially or just a lot in general, you will need to change the oil more frequently. Use a good quality small engine oil, making sure to use the correct weight according to your manufacturer's specifications. Most tractor engines use SAE 30 weight oil. There are some such as Honda, Kohler Pro, and Kawasaki that use a multi weight like 10w30. Tractors used during the winter months will often use a 5w30 oil.

Changing the oil filter is just as important. Your average homeowner that changes the oil once a year does not necessarily need to change the filter every year. This depends on the conditions you are mowing in. If you have a lot of sand and dust, then you should change the filter yearly. If you have a manicured lawn with irrigation, you can change the filter every other year. If your oil is black - you need to change the

filter. If the oil is clean at the end of the season, you can get away with not changing the filter. When changing the filter, it is best to use the filter recommended for that engine. DO NOT use automotive filters as they do not offer the same filtration as a small engine filter.

The best method for changing the oil and filter on your lawn or garden tractor is to start by warming up the engine. This will get the oil hot and will ensure it all drains out with the impurities. Once the oil is drained, spin off the old oil filter. Clean up any spilled oil. I usually take the new oil filter and prefill the filter with oil. (This is an age old debate, and many people opt not to prefill the filter. I like to prefill because it ensures there is no "dry run" for however many seconds it takes for the filter to fill up with oil.)

Spin the new filter on and hand tighten only! Do not use a filter wrench to tighten as you could pinch the seal on the filter and cause it to leak. You will also have a harder time removing the filter at the next oil change. All you need to do is snug the filter by hand. Then - fill the crankcase with fresh small engine oil of the correct weight and amount for that engine.

Now you are ready to start your engine and let it run for a couple minutes. Shut the engine off and recheck your oil. Top off the oil as needed to bring the oil to full on the dipstick. Finally, some people like to put the date and or hours on the oil filter. This is a good practice to follow.

This is just a general summary of performing an oil change. There may be additional steps involved with different tractor models. Always refer to your owner's manual for specific instructions on performing engine oil changes and other maintenance.

I hope you found this information helpful. In the next issue, we will discuss flat tires - what a pain!! LOL!

#### **JULY 2024 EVENTS**

If you are looking for redundant, you are pretty much in the right place.

#### LAKE CITY "GREATEST FOURTH IN THE NORTH" PARADE THURSDAY, JULY 04, 2024 10:00 a.m.

We have permission to use the vacant lot that used to be the elementary school. West from the M-66/M-55 intersection, proceed to Houghton Lake Street and turn right (south). It runs along the east side of Lake City High School. The next right turn (west) is Russell Street. Proceed to the vacant lot at the northwest corner of Russell Street and Pine Street. Once deployed, it may be easier to take the driveway north/northeast to the main parking lot and to M-55/Houghton Lake Road.

Mike filed, as is our practice, to request placement early in the parade to allow adequate time at the end of the parade to load up and head for Fife Lake. When they accomodate us, we typically line up on Broadway Street. So, to get there, turn left (west) on M-55 and proceed straight through the stop light.

It then becomes Park Street. Proceed to the curve which becomes Perry Street. Cross over Fisher Street to Broadway Street. From there it will be a right or left turn depending on our assignment. My stock recommendation each year, however, is 'follow Mike.'

Line up begins at 8:30 AM and the parade begins at 10:00. It goes through downtown Lake City and several neighborhoods. It ends at/near Russell Street. Hypothetically, (how is that for a \$5 word when a \$1 one would do) parade units are deemed to have the right of way on Russell Street.

There are no detours or road construction in the immediate Lake City area.

**Cautionary notes:** This year they are only doing a 5K run. Part of these runs are done on Broadway Street. Also, as in past years, watch for ATVs in and around the park area.

# FIFE LAKE FOURTH OF JULY PARADE THURSDAY, JULY 04, 2024 2:00 PM

When leaving for Fife Lake, pull out on northbound Houghton Street to M-55/ Houghton Lake Road. Turn right (east) and go .2 mile to northbound Decker Road. There is a red

barn on the property at the norhteast corner.
Take Decker Road .9 mile to Sanborn Road.
There is a Blair Storage sign on the west side just before intersection.

Turn left (west) on Sanborn Road and go .4 mile to M-66/Morley Road. Turn right (north) on M-66/Morley Road and proceed 15.7 miles to Ingersoll Road. There is a loose gravel advisory sign on Ingersoll. Except for two short strips, the loose gravel has been pushed to the side by traffic.

Once on Ingersoll Road, proceed 7.8 miles to the stop sign at Coster SW. Turn right (northwest – up stream) and 1.0 mile into the downtown area. Carefully cross the Great Lakes Central Railroad tracks (Never trust a train. They have loco motives). After the tracks, bear left on State Street.

Continue to Fife Lake Road (museum corner). Turn right and proceed to the parking lot of FOREST AREA CREDIT UNION at the intersection of Fife Lake Road and U.S. 131. The street address is 638 Boyd Street, Fife Lake 49633. Please make sure the drive up area and night depository are not blocked.




